Tasmania Forestry Hub

The Tasmania Forestry Hub aims to grow a sustainable and innovative forest industry, that supports and is supported by Tasmania's community.

The Hub is part of a network of 11 Regional Forestry Hubs across Australia.

These were established by the Commonwealth under the 2018 National Forestry Industry Plan.

Funding is committed until 2027 for Hubs to continue providing advice, technical assessment and analyses supporting forestry industry growth.



The Hub has consulted with Tasmanian stakeholders to identify four strategic priorities:

- Carbon Policy
- Workforce, Skills and Training
- Resource and Land Access
- Supply Chain and Infrastructure

The Hub has supported the industry and provided strategic advice on pathways to growth and removal of barriers through delivering 12 projects since its establishment in 2019.
